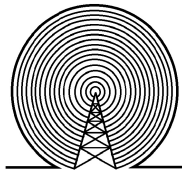

2004 VE Summary

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

Over that past six years the AARC VE Team has averaged 110 test applicants per year. This does not include hams who are doing a paperwork upgrade. During that same period, an average of 54 people per year became new hams and an average of 33 hams per year upgraded their license.

In 2002 we had 156 applicants which resulted in 71 new hams and 49 hams upgraded their license. This was our busiest year in the history of the AARC VE Team. We averaged 13 applicants per month and each monthly session produced an average of 6 new hams and nearly 5 hams upgraded their license each month.

During 2005, we had 64 applicants which resulted in 31 new hams and only 15 hams upgraded their license. That's an average of

5 applicants per month with less than 3 new hams and less than 2 upgrades each month. Statistically speaking, this was our worst year during the past six years.

Since 2002 the number of applicants, new hams has steadily declined and while the number of license upgrades has fluctuated it too is showing a decline.

So what caused these decreases? I don't know, I can only speculate.

Since mid-summer when the FCC announced their proposal to drop code as a test element, several local hams are waiting to see what the FCC is going to do about the code requirement. So is code the only reason why Technicians aren't upgrading? I don't think so, but it has been a factor. This question has many possible answers, all of which are undocumented and speculative at best.

If our test results are any indication of a nationwide trend, our hobby continues to be a male dominated hobby. Of the 322 new hams we've produced, 79.5% are males and 20.5% are females. Since 2002, the three year average number of YLs who earned a license through us has been 14. This year we had two and one of them wasn't from this country.

Ken has taken a new job in Garrett County so he and his bride Sandy will be moving to West Virginia where Ken describes life as being slower paced. Good luck to Ken and Sandy.

Repeater Interference

I'm sitting here listening to a constant tone coming over the 105 repeater. Someone is sitting on their mike and not only pressing the PTT button but also pressing one of the DTMF buttons. The repeater timed out but I could still hear it on the repeater input as I have a very high antenna. I cleared the timer and turned on the PL but they had their PL on so that didn't help. I just disabled the repeater transmitter and monitored the repeater input frequency. When the repeater times out, nobody can use it until it resets which won't happen until the signal on the input goes away. This went on for around 45 minutes until the person finally realized their rig was transmitting continuously. This happened on Monday morning, Dec. 26th. So now is a good time for everyone to check their rigs and set the transmit time-out timer if not already set. Unless your really long-winded, 5 minutes is a good setting.

CC&R Legislation in Coming Maryland General Assembly Session

You may recall that early this year the General Assembly considered Senate Joint Resolution 2, Amateur Radio - Support and Encouragement. It passed the Senate 46-0, thanks to an outstanding panel of witnesses in the Senate hearing and strong support from the amateur community. The bill made no progress in the House, despite vigorous support from the Amateur community. The Baltimore Amateur Radio Club's legislative affairs team met with House Speaker Busch several weeks ago, and he explained that the House feels that resolutions are a poor way to make public policy -- bills are preferable.

Sen. Katherine Klausmeier and Del. Wade Kach are planning to introduce a bill in the upcoming General Assembly session containing the following provisions:

(a) The governing documents of homeowners associations (single-family and townhouse communities) adopted after Sept 30, 2006 must contain a specific statement that assigns sole authority over Amateur Radio equipment to FCC and local government.

(b) Existing homeowners associations may not amend their documents on or after October 1, 2006 to further restrict or prohibit Amateur Radio equipment.

Our strategy from a year ago has not changed; this is the bill that the team expected to have introduced at this time if SJ2 passed. Speaker Busch found nothing objectionable in the 2006 bill, but urged us to explain it to all the groups that may be interested and if possible incorporate their views, before it is introduced.

We wanted to start with the simplest possible legislation that would do some good right away. This legislation is NOT retroactive -- it does not affect existing covenants or rules. It stops the spread of antenna prohibitions, but has no effect over the existing ones. This is because we have been told that retroactivity would make this bill unlikely to pass. It does not affect condos because they are far more complex, with the common property intermingled with the residents' property -- some condos may own the interiors of walls, some may own balconies, all probably own the roofs and all surrounding land. This bill removes the authority of the HOA over amateur antennas and related structures, but does not add to the existing authority of local government. PRB-1 and P.L. 103-408 now require local government to accommodate Amateur Radio reasonably. PRB-1 requires the minimum practicable regulation to achieve a legitimate purpose. Experience with this bill will guide future legislative efforts.

The 2006 session begins in about 60 days. Between now and then we intend to do two things: (1) get the views of groups that may be affected, including, of course, as many Amateur Radio clubs as possible, and (2) acquire written statements of support for the legislation from educators, emergency managers, and others around the state. I will send more information on item (2) as soon as I develop the format for the statements. I will also let you know if the bill changes significantly. The only thing you need to do now is decide whether to invite me to visit your club and when. After the session starts in mid-January, there will be more for you to do. Your support for SJ2 last winter was widely praised.

Questions and suggestions are welcome.
