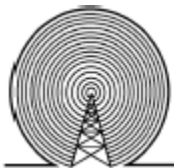

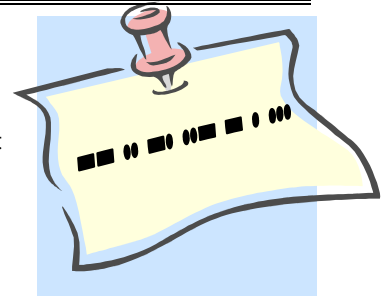
- **Clubs retain \$15 for each new membership OR lapsed membership (of two years or more).**

W3IVM Becomes Silent Key

We have lost another member. Clifford Boyer Hyatt, 92, of Severna Park died December 15th at Anne Arundel Medical Center. Cliff has been a member of the Anne Arundel Radio Club since 1992.

He was born in Damascus, MD. He served in the Coast Guard as a radio operator from 1935 to 1938. After his discharge, he continued working as a radio operator in various airports. He was an airport manager and radio technician in Nenana, Alaska. Most recently, he was chief electronics manager for the FAA at the former Friendship Airport, now BWI-Thurgood Marshall Airport.

In addition to AARC, he was a member of the Woods Memorial Presbyterian Church in Severna Park, The Severna Park Elks Lodge 2482, the Wally Byam Airstream Club and the Good Sam Trailor Club.

Survivors include his wife of 65 years, Geraldine Vasant Hyatt, two sons, one daughter, six grandchildren and four great- grandchildren.

Summary of 2007 VE Test Results

de AA3RR

This past year was a very busy year for the AARC VE Team. We administered exams to 174 applicants, which breaks our old record of 156, which we set in 2002. During the year, we helped 67 applicants become new hams, which included 61 Technicians and 6 Generals. We also helped 46 applicants upgrade to General and 16 to Amateur Extra. Morse code exams ceased as an exam element in February, after our exam session.

The pass rate for the Element 2 exams increased from the previous year, which attests to the preparation of the applicants. The pass rate for the Element 3 exams was the lowest in the previous three years and the pass rate for Element 4 was the same as last year. We had a new question pool implemented in July and a quick comparison of the old question pool pass rates (Jan-Jun 07) and the new question pool-based exams (Jul-Dec 07) suggests that there isn't a significant difference (70% versus 68%). I believe that the pass rate for the Element 4 exams reflects the difficulty of the exams. The table below is pretty self-explanatory.

That means that effective July 1st; all new Element 4 exams will be used in our exam sessions. That also means we might see an increase in the number of applicants taking the Element 4 exam between January and June. It seems a lot of folks try to pass the exam before the new question pool goes into effect.

I also look forward to seeing you at a test session in 2008 and congratulating you on your upgrade!

The 2008 Winter Field Day will be held from 1700 UTC (12:00 noon EST) Saturday January 26, 2008 through 1700 UTC (12:00 noon EST) Sunday January 27, 2008. The object of the event is familiar to most Amateur Radio operators: set up emergency-style communications and make as many contacts as possible during the 24 hour period. The rules encourage as many contacts on as many bands and modes as possible, because during a real emergency, the most important factor is the ability to communicate, regardless of band, mode or distance.

Object: To work as many amateur stations in as many different two degrees by one degree grid squares as possible using authorized frequencies above 50 MHz. Foreign stations work W/VE amateurs only.

Student News

- Welcome to Rick/KF2TP, Long Beach (LI), NY and Gil/N2WJW, Hillsborough, NJ. Info packets were emailed to both and we look forward to hearing you on the Net. We're looking forward to hearing Rick/N8MFN, Mike/WA2VLA and Jason/KI34OSH begin the training course. Bill/K3ZYK is nearly ready to complete the course. Great work, Bill.

Net Protocol

- When stations are sent off net frequency, the NCS **usually** calls the RX station first and the TX station second. It's the responsibility of the RX station to move to the assigned frequency, up or down, and if that frequency is QRL, to keep moving in the direction sent, find a clear frequency and call the TX station several times if the band is busy or noisy. Give the TX station a chance to find you.
- QNZ! It's very important to QNZ or zero beat the NCS. Filters are tighter now and it's important to be zero beat with the NCS **who sets the net frequency** based on band and other conditions. Turn off the RIT and VOX, operate your key(er) and tune the receiver until your sidetone matches the NCS or TX station signal. <http://home.comcast.net/~fairbank56/zerobeat.html> will give you some great information. If the link fails, ask Eric/N3EF for a direct link to the site.
- W8CPG recommends that NCS's avoid using "DIT" and the doubled "DIT DIT DIT DIT" to alert the Net that a request is imminent. All Net participants are expected to be alert and prepared to QNG if something should prevent the NCS from continuing Net operation, e.g. power failure, lightning storm or some of those pesky li'l springs that sometimes launch themselves from the keyer. Avoiding unnecessary DITs is good practice and teaches, by example, proper procedure to new Students.

Around The Net

- In a recent QSO Roy/WA2TWS and Bruce/W8CPG learned that Roy plays mandolin in a pickup band called Sons of the Whiskey Rebellion. W8CPG plays Old Time Clawhammer banjo, and sometimes in the back of his pickup truck (but only in warm weather and when there is no rebellion against whiskey).
- Bill/WB9LBI noted that in a recent chat with Sam/KG2HA Sam said he is in his early nineties, a retired chemistry and physics professor, and is active in the Rotary Club and two radio clubs.
- The MSN Training Manual is being revised to reflect changes in frequencies and procedures. Instructors look for the Revised December 2007 edition coming soon.
