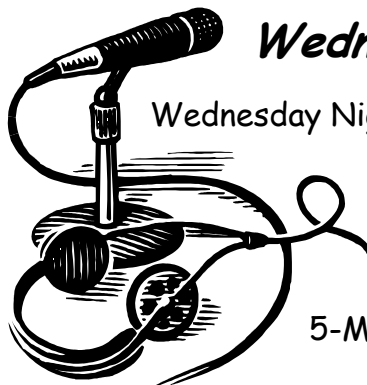

### **Free Money for AARC!**

ARRL Affiliated Clubs receive a commission for every new ARRL membership and renewal they submit to ARRL Headquarters. Clubs retain a portion of the dues for each regular or senior membership submitted to ARRL Headquarters:

- **Clubs retain \$15 for each new membership OR lapsed membership (of two years or more).**
- **Clubs retain \$2 for each renewal. A RENEWING MEMBER can renew at anytime, even before their current membership term expires.**

## **FAR Scholarships Available**

The Foundation for Amateur Radio, Inc., a non-profit organization with headquarters in Washington, D.C., plans to administer fifty-five (55) scholarships for the academic year 2008 - 2009 to assist licensed Radio Amateurs. The Foundation, composed of over seventy-five local area Amateur Radio Clubs, fully funds three of these scholarships. Eleven are funded with the income from grants. The remaining forty-one (41) are administered by the Foundation without cost to the various donors.



Licensed Radio Amateurs may compete for these awards if they plan to pursue a full-time course of studies beyond high school and are enrolled in or have been accepted for enrollment at an accredited university, college or technical school. The awards range from \$500 to \$3000 with preference given in some cases to residents of specified geographical areas or the pursuit of certain study programs. Non-USA residents are eligible for some of the scholarships. Clubs, especially those in California, Delaware, Maryland, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia and Wisconsin (areas of preferred residence for some of the scholarships), are encouraged to announce these opportunities at their meetings, in their club newsletters, during training classes, on their nets and on their world wide web home pages.

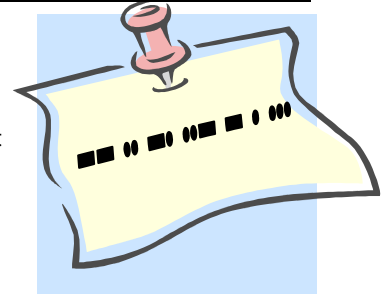

Hello Everyone:

Well its time to start thinking of Public Service again for the new year. One of our annual events is to provide communication for the Anne Arundel SPCA Walk for the Animals. This year the walk will be held on April 27<sup>th</sup>. The location will be Quiet Waters Park, as usual.



We need at least 8 people to support the walk, one person for each checkpoint and a net controller. It is OK if we have more than one person at a checkpoint. This is a pretty laid back event but almost everyone who has worked it in the past has had a good time.

The only communication equipment you will need is a 2-meter handheld radio with a fully charged battery. We will use simplex 146.430 for the walk and check in will be on the club 2 meter repeater.

The seven checkpoints around the course need to be manned at the following times

Net Control 7:00AM (I'll handle this)

Checkpoint One-7:45AM . The checkpoint is on the trail near parking lot L. Lisa and Eric have volunteered to staff this checkpoint.

Checkpoint Two-7:45AM . The checkpoint is located at the turn around point of the trail near parking lot N.

Checkpoint Three-8:00 AM. This checkpoint is located on the trail near parking lot J.

Checkpoint Four- 8:15AM. This checkpoint is located on the trail and is the most isolated. There is no nearby parking but we will make sure that whoever works this checkpoint will be provided transportation.

Chekpont Five-8:30AM. This checkpoint is just inside the park, about 50 yards after you turn off Hillsmere Drive. It is located where the trail crosses the road. The nearest parking, which has seemed to work best for people in the past, is in the shopping center parking lot across from the park entrance.

Checkpoint Six-8:45 AM. This checkpoint is located on the trail near Sassafras Pavilion. Parking is available in parking lot B.

Checkpoint Seven- 9:00. This checkpoint is located on the trail near Sycamore Pavilion. Parking is available in parking lot F.

**ALL CHECKPOINTS WILL CLOSE NO LATER THAN 12 NOON**

Talk in on 147.105, walk on simplex 146.430.

There will be no parking or entry to the Blue Heron Center parking area after 7:15 on the day of the walk.

Other items you might want to consider bringing are an extra battery, something to drink, a folding chair and some bug spray.

Please consider volunteering for this event and let me know via e-mail if you have a preference for a checkpoint. I'll have maps of the course available at the April Business and Program meetings.

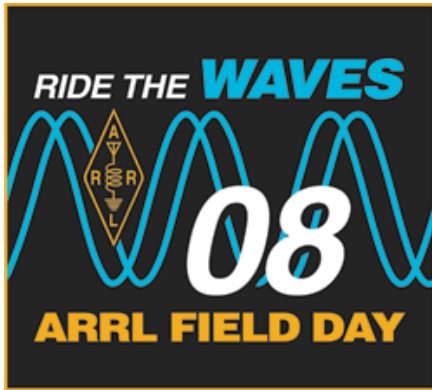

### *Net Protocol*

- Students – when you need fills for missed or not understood words, please use WA (Word After) or WB (Word Before) the last word copied correctly. Use AA – (All After) the last correct word, and BN – (Between two specific words) where several words have been missed. Refer to the “Operating Tips” page in your information packet. The key is brevity with clarity so your Instructor will understand what you need without having to re-send an entire Tng Msg. Comments such as “R R R I got It” vs. “QSL” or “Keep Going” vs. WA, WB, etc. are incorrect procedure and not helpful in getting the needed words.
- NCS's - the use of “Up X” or “Down XX” instead of using “QNY Up X” seems to be working well in directing Students and Instructors off net frequency for traffic and training. The direction is clear without the redundancy of using both QNY and Up or Down. If you believe your station operators are unclear about your intent use the QNY also, especially if band conditions are poor.

### *Around The Net*

- Some modest corrections were made to the MSN Training Manual and e- and snail mailed to current Instructors. Thanks to Gery/VE2KRM for doing the proofing and editing. More errors may be found as we use the Manual, so let me know if you spot errors, typos or items needing clarification.
- Welcome back to long time Instructor Andy/N3NNH. Andy has a new antenna system that makes his crisp fist much more audible. Good to have you back, Andy.
- Robin/AA3SB and Rusty/N3WKE re-installed a higher long wire antenna over a 65 ft tree at their MD QTH. Robin noted the antenna needed to be replaced after several very windy days had swept the tree out from under the antenna. Yep – those winter winds are tough on antennas even these in WV hollers!
