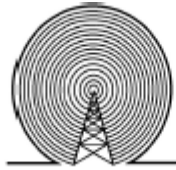

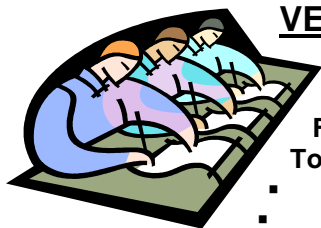

### Free Money for AARC!

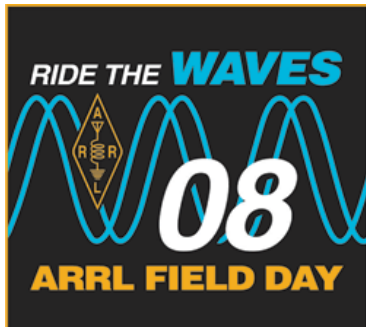

Bob Israel, WC3I, received his 40-year membership pin from ARRL recently. Bob currently lives in Arizona but has maintained his long-time membership in AARC.

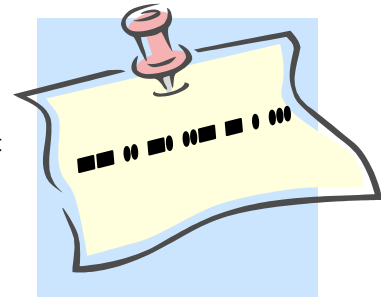

Francis (Frank) Sylvester Dunn, a resident of Crofton for 36 years, died of heart failure May 15<sup>th</sup> at Baltimore Washington Medical Center after a year-long illness.

He is survived by Mabel Dunn, his wife of over 50 years, one son, two daughters, one sister and four grandchildren.

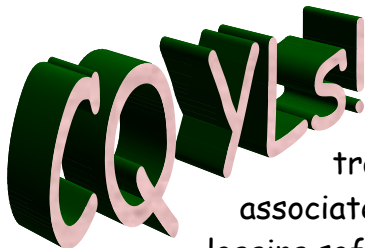

Steve Kelly, serves on the VE team, works full time, maintains our website, and helps with the kids club. John Williams, maintains all of our repeaters, fixes club equipment, coordinates ARES/RACES issues, does a lot of research for us, and buys equipment for us on a regular basis. Holly Bevan serves as our ambassador of good will, manages our morning commuter net, maintains club attendance rosters, and is our official PR person. Bruce Stewart manages our Maryland slow net. Oscar Ramsey, devotes tons of his time to repairing equipment for the radio museum and still has found the time to sit on the board, and has taught literally hundreds if not thousands of students in his and Tony's Technician classes over the years. We could never thank Ted Redick enough for the massive amount time he has donated over the years to coordinate communications for community events. Tony Young has functioned several times as club President, Vice President, has taught many Technician classes with Oscar, and donates a tremendous amount of his time to the radio museum as well. Gerri Harlow volunteered to manage field day this year when no one else would step forward to do it. Fred Koester who works full time, donates a great deal of time to his hunt club, coordinates any/all PA events (like Roedown) and still manages to find the time to sit on the

board of directors and cook for us regularly (yummy). Lisa Fairbank who worked full time, started her own business, and still took on the job(s) of multiple board members for more than one year when no one else would take it (to include the treasury which is huge). Eric Fairbank helps John maintain the repeaters helped install our backup generator. Frank Winner does a massive amount of work ARES/RACES.
