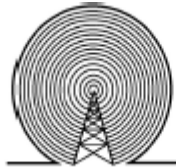

If you have changes to the roster, make sure they are on your membership renewal for 2008. Check to see that your email address is correct, and choose areas of interest at the club where you would like to help out.

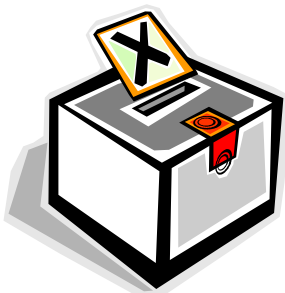

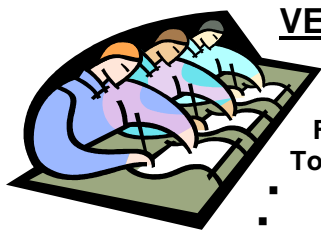

ARRL Affiliated Clubs receive a commission for every new ARRL membership and renewal they submit to ARRL Headquarters. Clubs retain a portion of the dues for each regular or senior membership submitted to ARRL Headquarters:

- **Clubs retain \$15 for each new membership OR lapsed membership (of two years or more).**
- **Clubs retain \$2 for each renewal. A RENEWING MEMBER can renew at anytime, even before their current membership term expires.**

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

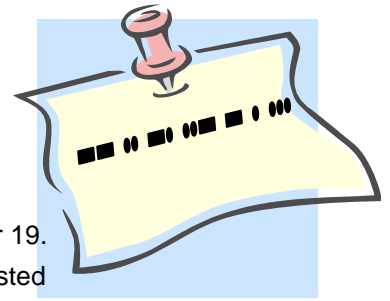
AARC Program Meeting for October 16, 2008

75th Annual November Sweepstakes



The very popular November Sweepstakes contest, sponsored by the ARRL, is offered in two versions: CW (1-3 Nov) and Phone (15-17 Nov).

AARC Jr. is going to operate 2 or 3 stations during the phone version (15-17 November). The contest starts at 4:00pm on Saturday and lasts for 30 hours. We will operate starting at 4:00pm on Saturday and end at 4:00pm on Sunday.

This year's contest will be a three part event:

Part 1 - An amateur radio contest - We have no pretensions of winning the contest but we're there to have lots of fun.

Part 2 - A training event – Because this contest is limited to US and Canadian operators, this is a great opportunity, especially for new hams (e.g., Technicians) and recently upgraded General licensees to get your feet wet in the world of HF contesting. Under the guidance of an experienced operator, you'll learn about:

- The contest exchange
- Propagation and band conditions
- Logging software and how to use it
- Operating techniques
- How long 24 hours really is

It's a great opportunity to develop and practice your operating skills as they would apply to Field Day (27-28 June 2009) which is only 224 days away from Nov 15th.

Part 3 - A social event – This is an opportunity to meet and chat with old friends and maybe make some new friends. This year we're going to celebrate with what could become the first **Annual November Sweepstakes Picnic** complete with grilled hot dogs and burgers.

Everyone is invited to stop by to visit, chat, have a burger or dog, and get on the radio.

If you're coming by, consider bringing a dish to pass (Soup, salad, casserole, dessert, etc.) and let's have some fun or better yet, a lot of fun!
