I think it's appropriate for us review all the neat stuff we have accomplished at the club. This has been a great Board of Directors willing to make things happen for the club, and it could not have happened without the contributions of time and efforts of the club members. Great Job!

Training Programs: The License Classes for new Hams and Hams to upgrade has been one of our biggest successes. We have grown in membership as a result of it. The club has grown closer together as we work together to plan lessons and attend classes. In the past we sponsored one Technician Class per year in the spring. We are now sponsoring 2 Technician Classes and a General Class. On top of that we had a very successful Extra Class Study Hall. Club membership is in great shape and growing. This has been a win-win for all.

New Members: With the classes we offer, the VE testing, and word of mouth, we have had great success in getting visitors to the club house. The visitors often become new members. We have a total of 23 business/program meetings per year. We have only had 2 meetings where we did not have new members to vote in. That's a great record! As I told you recently, some of our newest members have become some of our most active members.

New Website: This has been a huge success and a great form of communications. At the November Sweepstakes last month we had streaming video on the AARC website so that everyone could see the contesting going on.

Internet Access at the club house: We now have Internet Access for club activities.

Wi-Fi Access in the club house: Now for Club meetings and other events you can use your computer at the club to access the internet. What a great idea!

Newsletter: is the best ever. Andrea has done an exceptional job putting it together and keeping it new and fresh each month. All I can say is check out some of the other clubs in the area, look at their website, check out their newsletter, we have the best!!

Outstanding Program Presentations: If you had a chance to attend any of the program meetings this year I am sure you will agree they have been the best. We have a short presentation at the business meeting and a full blown presentation on the third Thursday of the month.

Wednesday Night Talk Net: This has been a very popular event every Wednesday night. We have 20+ check ins and some great conversations. The last month or so, after the net, we have gone to one of the other AARC repeaters or on to H.F. for some additional testing, and conversations.

This net is another great communications tool to keep everyone at the club and others talking to one another and updating everyone on news and successes at the club.

New Equipment at the club house: Over the last 1½ years we added some great new equipment, a new laptop computer & printer, a new projector to go with the computer. Those have really enhanced presentations at the club. We also now have a computer router/Wi-Fi network inside the club house. We are in the process of completing the security update which will include a card reader on the Front Door and Ham Shack to allow more access to the club.

The county has helped to pay for the repeater tower to be re-tensioned and for additional antennas to be put up for emergency use. We also put up 1 new small tower and replaced one tower up against the club house. As we move to make the ham shack more available we have an Antenna Committee that is deciding on what new antennas we should put up for HF. Once we get the antennas chosen, we will put together a Ham Shack Committee to redesign the ham shack and look at some new equipment for it. Talking about new equipment: what about the new much needed refrigerator?

AARC & AARC Jr. Renewed joint activity: I am very, very, very, happy to say that everyone in the club is doing very, very, very, well at working together as one big group. AARC Jr. has done an extremely great job at getting people together for contesting, club house activities, creating antennas, teaching members to contest and feel comfortable getting on HF. They are planning a homemade soup and bread event for some contesting in January for the North American QSO Party. As advertised on the web "At the AARC Clubhouse on Jan 17, AARC Jr. (K13DS) will participate in the winter phone version of the North American QSO Party at the AARC Clubhouse from 1:00 pm (17 Jan) until 1:00 am (18 Jan). Everyone is invited!

Field Day 2009: Bob & Kim Delamarter will coordinate next year's Field Day. This will be a great example of the entire club working together for one event. As you can tell by all the videos Bob Rose has put together, this is going to be a huge club event.

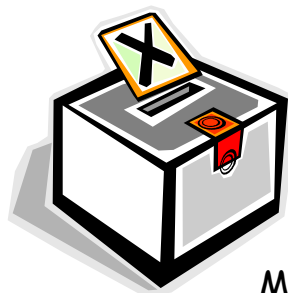
Free Money for AARC!

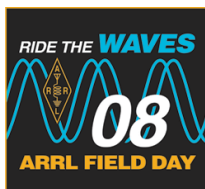

Field Day 2008

Results



Submitted by AA3RR on Sat, 11/15/2008 - 7:10pm.

The ARRL has published the results from Field Day 2008 on their web-site and in the December issue of QST.
ARRL Summary:

The total number of submitted by clubs, groups and individuals = 2410

The total number QSOs made = 1,226,258 (avg 509 [High=10,709 Low=1]).

The total number of participants/visitors = 35,767 (avg 15 [High=198 Low=1])

There are three power multipliers used to determine the score:

5 = 5w or less and using batteries, solar panels, wind generators or water generators

2 = 6-150 watts

1 = 151-1500 watts

Eighty five percent (2060) of the total FD entries were "power multiplier 2"

Four percent (252) of the total FD entries were "power multiplier 5"

Four percent (98) of the total FD entries were "power multiplier 1"

KI3DS Summary

KI3DS (AARC Jr.) operated 5 stations (5A) with power multiplier 2 for an average of 147 contacts per station.

Only 68 of the 2410 entries (0.03%) operated as 5A with Power multiplier 2.

KI3DS made 730 QSOs and had 50 visitors/participants and scored 3,090 points

KI3DS made 540 phone contacts, 182 CW contacts and 8 digital contacts.

KI3DS exceeded the average number of QSOs per entry by 221

KI3DS finished 29th out of 68 entries in the 5A Power Multiplier 2.

KI3DS finished 3rd out of 8 entries in the 5A Power Multiplier 2 category within the Atlantic Division

KI3DS finished 1st out of 2 entries in the 5A Power Multiplier 2 category within the Maryland-DC Section.

Arguably, KI3DS had more fun.

W3VPR Summary

W3VPR (AARC) operated 3 stations (3AB) with power multiplier 5 with an average of 99 contacts per station.

Only 8 of the 2410 entries (0.003%) operated as 3AB with Power multiplier 5.

W3VPR made 297 QSOs and had 58 visitors/participants and scored 3,670 points

W3VPR made 20 phone contacts, 277 CW contacts, and no digital contacts.

W3VPR fell short of the average number of QSOs per entry by 212

W3VPR finished 3rd out of 8 entries in the 3AB Power Multiplier 5 category.

W3VPR was the only 5A Power Multiplier 2 category within the Atlantic Division

W3VPR was the only 5A Power Multiplier 2 category within the Maryland-DC Section.

Governor Martin O'Malley Joins the Maryland Historical Society for Commemoration of Maryland World War II Veterans

BALTIMORE, MD (November 11, 2008) – Governor Martin O'Malley recognized Veterans Day today by participating in the Maryland Historical Society's Commemoration of Maryland Veterans of World War II. Governor O'Malley offered remarks honoring those veterans, many of whom were in attendance at the special ceremony. As the son of a World War II veteran, Governor O'Malley offered his thanks on behalf of the people of Maryland for the heroism exhibited by the "Greatest Generation."

"Our nation is built upon the generations of brave men and women who squared their shoulders against the forces of fear and tyranny so that we could continue to enjoy the blessings of this nation and our way of life," said Governor O'Malley. "Just as these veterans have always been there for us through times of turmoil and tranquility, famine, flood and war, we as a people are committed to being there for them."



The Maryland Historical Society opened the exhibition entitled "Maryland Veterans of World War II: Our Arsenal of Democracy" today, which will run through the end of 2009. The uniforms, arms, and equipment in the exhibition are authentic to the men who wore them, often "personalized" with their own artistic touches. Helmets are inscribed with individual names and units, and in some cases pierced by shrapnel and bullet holes. Weapons carry the dents and dings of active fighting from the Normandy beaches to Iwo Jima.

"We owe a special debt to those veterans who served our country in World War II," said Brig. Gen. James A. Adkins, Maryland Secretary of Veterans Affairs and Maryland National Guard Adjutant General. "They changed the history of the world and the world and our nation have benefited from their service. They will always be cherished in the memory of our countrymen."

There were 288,000 Maryland men and women who served in World War II. Of these, 6,454 did not come home. Their names are listed in the exhibition and are honored by its visitors. Currently, 374 soldiers from Maryland serve in active duty in Iraq and Afghanistan.

"We are blessed to have been born in the strongest and freest republic ever known to man, and that its tomorrow's are not inevitable," said Governor O'Malley. "Instead, they are secured by men and women who are willing to step up, especially in times of great adversity, because that's what defines the character of a nation."

The ceremony also included musical performances by the Baltimore City College Choir, and an acknowledgement of the veterans past and present by various military leadership in attendance.
